The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him
Philip, mobs at Alexandria ranged the streets torturing and killing Christians. Among their victims was Apollonia, and old deaconess, who was tortured when she would not renounce her Christianity and when given a moment's respite leaped voluntarily into the fire the mob built and was threatening to throw her into. She is represented by a gold tooth or pincer, since her teeth were pulled out during her torture. In the same mob, Metras, an old man, was tortured and stoned to death;	to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking He said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signaled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point. When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners.
